


Alabama Baitfish and Sportfish




Alabama producers spend an estimated \$184,000 year on regulatory compliance.

This breaks down to an average cost of \$30,716/farm, or \$455/acre.

On average Alabama producers are faced with 4 permit and license renewals per year. Some report in excess of 10 annual renewals.

Regulations account for about **7%** of farm costs




Cost of Regulatory Categories

Alabama producers ship live fish to 6 other states on average. Some producers ship to 13 states.
