Pennsylvania Baitfish and Sportfish


Pennsylvania producers ship live fish to 3 other states on average. Some producers ship to 7 states.



Pennsylvania producers spend an estimated \$680,000 per year on regulatory compliance.

This breaks down to an average cost of \$35,741/farm, or \$6,264/acre.

On average Pennsylvania producers are faced with 5 permit and license renewals per year. Some report 15 annual renewals.



Cost of Regulatory Categories


