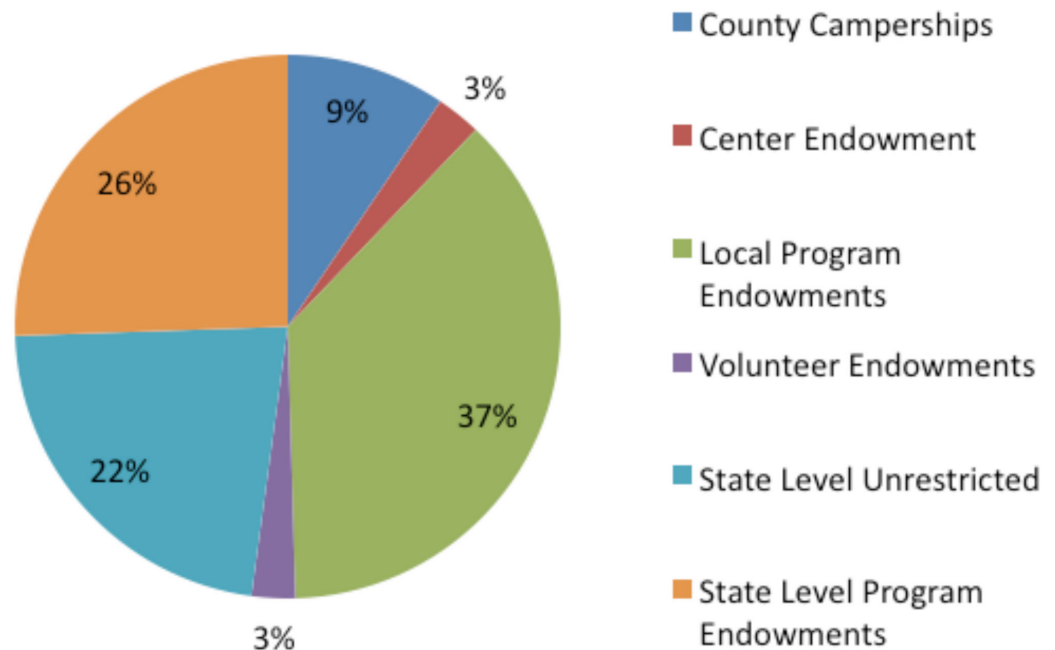
Virginia 4-H Foundation

The Virginia 4-H Foundation is a portfolio of accounts within the Virginia Tech Foundation. Leadership of the 4-H Foundation is a partnership between the State 4-H Office, the CALS Development Office, and the officers of the 4-H Foundation.

Within the foundation there are 34 endowments totaling \$2,442,239 (as of June 30, 2011). Thirteen are local program endowments, five are campership endowments, two support volunteer organizations and one supports a 4-H center. The remaining endowments support state-level programming and unrestricted needs. There are just under 200 operating accounts and income funds in the 4-H Foundation designated for a variety of uses.

Currently, 52% of the collective endowment value is restricted for local program support, local program camperships, volunteer organization support and 4-H center support. 48% is designated for state-level use including unrestricted program needs and program area support.

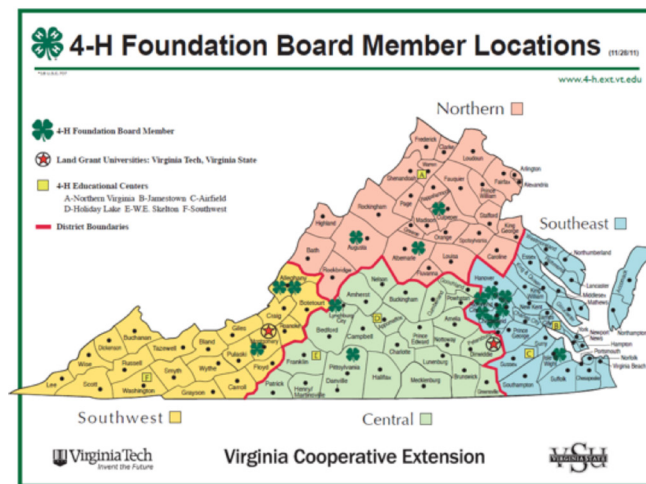
- 100% giving by board members in FY 2010 and FY 2011
